Securing energy and conservation of the environment are the most important issues for the sustainable development of human beings. To solve various problems of energy and the environment, the Graduate School of Energy Science was founded in April 1996, by gathering wide-ranging academic areas including technology, science, agriculture, economics, law, and so forth. The Graduate School has been working on the creation of novel learning methods in energy science, on the development of technology for energy and the environment, on the cultivation of excellent human resources specialized in energy and the environment, and on making a contribution to society. The International Energy Science Course is offered to provide foreign students and researchers **an opportunity to further their studies toward a Master's degree at Kyoto University**. In the course, Japanese proficiency is not required since students can obtain the necessary credits by choosing classes among a variety of subjects presented in English and their research works are also supervised in English. An evaluation of eligibility for admission will be made on the basis of the documents submitted to our School Affairs Office. The course is run by the following three departments in the Graduate School of Energy Science:

- ✓ Department of Socio-Environmental Energy Science
- ✓ Department of Fundamental Energy Science
- ✓ Department of Energy Conversion Science

ELIGIBILITY

- Graduation from a university (or equivalent)
- Language ability: Good command of English (Japanese is not required)
